

Dear People of God,


What happens in a parish once the summer season begins? Actually, a parish continues to function as usual no matter what the season is. There is the regular schedule of Masses and sacramental rites that are celebrated. At St. Pat's we have a minimum of nine Masses each week. Then, there are funeral and wedding Masses, visitations to hospitals or homes to administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (which some of you still refer to wrongly as Last Rites), baptism, confessions (both at Saturday at 4:00 PM and by appointment in the office), and counseling sessions. Our Parish Office schedules the administration of sacramental rites and services as well as facilitates the use of different areas of our Church campus. The pastor acts as the Head of the Pastoral Staff in all of these duties and events. In addition, there are Archdiocesan meetings and events that he is expected to attend and participate in. The ebb and flow of people's lives often are intersected with other pastoral duties that priests perform as part of their role. Many of these roles are taught to us in seminary, but others just happen. For example, on Pentecost Sunday as I was preparing to preside at one of the Masses, an emergency of great proportion occurred and was brought to my attention for resolution—the overflowing of a toilet in the women's restroom. Unfortunately, I could not find a prayer or blessing to stem that tide.

We are planning to accomplish some repairs and beautification projects this summer. We are planting some new trees and bushes on the property. In the Parish Office building we are updating some of our offices and meeting spaces. In the Main Church, the sacristy is being renovated to increase the potential for more storage space and areas to help in preparing for our many varied liturgical celebrations. We have had a training session for new Eucharistic Ministers. A session is being planned for new altar servers.

The wedding season has begun; I presided at the first scheduled wedding here on May 19. Our parish school graduation Mass is today at 2:00 PM. Our new schedule for Baptism is ready to begin; this will help all of us to be a more welcoming Catholic communion of faith to these young children and their parents.

Next weekend is the annual collection for the retired priests of the Archdiocese. This collection will take place in all parishes. This yearly collection helps to supplement funding for our senior priests who are in need of additional medical and housing assistance. There is an envelope in your monthly packet for this purpose. Please place your offering envelope for this appeal in the regular offertory collection.

Q: Why do (some) Non-Catholics claim that Catholics are not Christians?

A: Argument #5: The Catholic Church believes that God is formed into a wafer-biscuit at the priest's command. However, Christ used the bread and wine of the Last Supper merely as symbols; emblems to remind believers that he has sacrificed for their sins, once and for all.

If we were impressed last week by the verbal ballet necessary to dismiss Christ's words about the Sacrament of Baptism, we are in for a real treat this week in our discussion about the Eucharist!

First, let us look at the Gospel of John. Throughout this gospel, Jesus speaks symbolically. This language often causes confusion in the minds of those listening, forcing Jesus to then explain exactly what he meant (Nicodemus in chapter 3, the woman at the well in chapter 4, the disciples in chapter 11 when he tells them that Lazarus is asleep). In John Chapter 6, Jesus tells the crowds to seek the true bread from Heaven, that he is the true bread from heaven, and that the bread he gives is his flesh for the life of the world. The crowd begins to grumble, asking 'how can this man give us his flesh to eat?' Jesus has the opportunity to explain to them that he was just talking symbolically, that it is merely meant to be a reminder that he sacrificed himself for their sins. Instead, he tells them, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him" (verses 54-56). Jesus was not talking symbolically! At the end of the passage, we find out that many of his disciples leave and return to their former way of life. Why does Jesus allow this to happen? Why doesn't he just tell them he was joking? Answer: Because he wasn't joking!

The scripture passages that record the intuition of the Eucharist also demonstrate Jesus' intention. "Take and eat. This is my body" (cf Matthew 26; Mark 14; Luke 22; I Corinthians 11). Not a single Evangelist or Apostle records Christ as saying, "Take and eat, this is merely a symbol of my body!" I cannot understand why a person who claims Scripture as the ultimate authority would not take Jesus at his words...

And let us not forget the next words that Jesus speaks in Luke and I Corinthians; "Do this in remembrance of me." This celebration was not supposed to be a one-time occurrence. Jesus wanted his apostles to continue this sacramental action in perpetuity. "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (Jn 6:53). Surely, there are many ways in which we can pray and honor and worship God. But Jesus tells us to 'DO THIS' specifically! This Eucharistic banquet is the perfect manner in which human beings are able to adore the Lord.

Finally, let us talk a little about Transubstantiation, because clearly, Catholics do not believe that God is formed into a wafer-biscuit at the priest's command! Remember our discussion last week about the Sacraments; these are physical signs perceptible to the senses that enable us to experience the invisible reality of God's love. Food is one of the most important aspects of human life. Without food, we die. When we eat food, we allow it into our bodies to nourish and sustain us in an intimate way. Through digestion, the food we eat becomes a part of us! God desires to experience intimacy with us in a powerful, tangible way; becoming food for us is the perfect method for achieving this intimacy.

When the priest prays over the bread and wine, the very substance of their matter is changed. Although it looks like bread and smells like bread and tastes like bread, its 'bread-ness,' the thing that makes it bread, is transformed into 'Jesus-ness.' And this transformation remains for as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Jesus is not staying in the host like a guest in a hotel; that host truly becomes the Body of Christ.

And of course, this makes total sense! If you had the power to have either a flesh and blood relationship with the person you love or merely a symbolic relationship with him/her, which would you chose?! God absolutely has the power to transform that wafer-biscuit into His Body. Ask your Protestant friend one simple question; "if God truly loves you, and has the power to enter into a physical, substantial relationship with you, why would He instead choose a relationship that was merely symbolic?"



Tithing Envelope Etiquette

A few friendly reminders of how to properly submit your tithing envelopes each week.

- * If you forget your envelope, there are blank tithing envelopes at the Welcome Center. If you do not know your envelope number, no worries, we go off the name on the envelope or check.
- * Please do not use tape to seal the envelope. It is very time consuming and messy for the counters to remove the tape.
- * Donations are recorded on the date they are received, not the date that is printed on the envelope or your check. If you miss Mass for a week, save yourself the check and just write one check. You will still be credited the amount of your donation.
- * Be sure to check the amount you write on the outside of the envelope coincides with the amount of your check or cash. It helps us with accuracy when we are counting the collection money.

Mission Trip to Piura, Peru

This is the sixteenth year that parishioners and friends of St. Patrick Church are going on a mission trip to Piura, Peru. Over the past fifteen years, over one hundred and fifty different individual missionaries have journeyed to minister to the poor in Piura. This year 25+ Missionaries are going to Piura, from June 29th through July 8.

Our goals this year are:

- Build eight shelters/homes
- Bring communion to shut-ins
- Have at least two outings taking ice cream to children in outlying villages
- Host a Vacation Bible School
- Help to prepare lunch for seniors at the skilled care home
- Visit and help at the girl's home and Catholic school
- Visit and help at the Hospice Home
- Visit the drug rehab and juvenile detention facility
- Deliver food and clothing to families
- Spend time with our sponsored families



Once again, we need your financial support to help build shelters, purchase furniture (beds, mattresses, tables and chairs). Bedding and housewares are also purchased for those who need them. With inflation, it now costs \$700 to build a shelter. Mattresses and other furniture costs have also risen and are approximately an additional \$300. Your contribution is greatly appreciated and will help us to achieve our goals.

Peru Ministry: Bridging the Americas through Faith

The Peru Ministry consists of two separate but connected services: The Family-to-Family (F2F) Program and the annual mission trip.

1. Currently there are 173 F2F sponsors that are providing \$25 per month to an impoverished family from Blessed Sacrament Parish in Piura, Peru. Basic food essentials include rice, beans, pasta, flour and milk to help supplement the food their meager incomes buy, to provide children nourishment, and most of all, to give these families hope. This is a parish and community of almost 40,000 people where the unemployment rate is at nearly 60%. Please consider joining the Family-to-Family (F2F) Program, "Feed the Hungry," by sponsoring a needy family in Piura with monthly food deliveries for \$25/month, which can be paid quarterly, semi-annually or annually. A one year commitment totals \$300.

2. Mission Trip to Peru – Join St. Patrick’s missionaries on their annual 10-day journey to Piura, Peru each summer. Besides meeting with some of the F2F “adopted” families (hopefully yours), you can assist the Santisimo Sacramento parish staff in performing many ministries. We “shelter the homeless” by building bamboo shelters with a tin roof (dirt floors), 8 – 10 in one week, for the poorest of the poor; many of whom live in sparse bamboo/cardboard shacks, if they have one at all. Additionally, the mission team delivers clothing, medical supplies, and school supplies; works the breakfast soup kitchen, conducts bible school sessions, administers communion to the sick, elderly and shut-ins; visits the girls’ home, senior center, domestic abuse survivors, hospice center, substance rehab program and the young men’s prison facility.
