

Dear People of God,

One of the interesting activities that I do each week is to read the church bulletin of all our neighboring parishes and those somewhat far way. I like to describe this as checking out the competition. Also, over the years I have served or assisted at many of them; this serves to keep a connection with former parishioners and friends.

Last week St. Peter's Parish in Antioch and St. Bede's Parish in Ingleside were formally merged into one new parish—Our Lady of the Lakes. This new entity will maintain the two former parish churches as weekly worship sites (at least for the present). There will be one pastor and one associate pastor for the new parish. There will be one parish school located at the St. Bede site. I was called to serve as the Administrator of St. Bede for a year shortly before coming here. Even when we serve at a parish for a relatively short period of time, the people there are special to the priest. I am grateful to our cardinal who often sends us to parishes that we probably wouldn't think of going to on our own. We as priests consider it a blessing to be called to serve a parish.

It is my fond hope that the newly formed parish of Our Lady of the Lakes will grow and prosper as the people there enter into a new adventure.

If you have not made your appointment to have your picture taken for our new Parish Pictorial Directory, I urge you to do so as soon as possible. There is a sign up table in the Narthex. There is also a table there so you can volunteer to assist at our Rummage Sale. Both of these endeavors are very important to our communal life here at St. Pat's.

Thank you to all who are assisting us each week as liturgical Ministers—lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, altar servers, ushers, hospitality greeters, cantors and musicians. If you find yourself being away, please try to find substitutes. And when you are serving, please dress appropriately for your particular roles. We are so blessed by the Church and this parish to be called to serve at worship each week. In the name of our whole parish community, I thank you for your willingness to serve. If you will be away, I invite you to bring back a parish bulletin from the church you have attended. Many of you have done this and I thank you.

We are in the midst of the wedding and quinceanera summer season. Every week I hear from our visitors at these services how beautiful and welcoming our church is. It is our privilege to serve all those who come to us. The one comment that so many people share with me is how awesome our worship is and how uplifting the music is. I couldn't agree more.

And, mark your calendars—the Parish Picnic will be Sunday, August 26 right here on our parish grounds. It all begins with a special Mass at 11:00 AM and continues throughout the afternoon. We are adding some new activities during the day, especially with our children and young people in mind. One hint—the ponies are getting ready to visit!



**Ask
A
Priest**

Q: If someone performs an evil act, either directly against us or against society, how are we supposed to love them? I think for example these people that perpetrate mass shootings in schools or movie theaters. When our military personnel get sent into hostile territory, what are they supposed to do about the people who are trying to kill them?

A: The Christian message of 'loving everyone' and 'turning the other cheek' really does sound wonderful in its ideology... but when push comes to shove, how do we respond to a person who hurts us or someone we care about? It's important for us to understand exactly what 'love' really means. In the language of St. Thomas Aquinas, love means that we 'will the good of the other as other.' Love, therefore, is not an emotion or sentiment; it is a decision.

So if you think about it, the opposite of love is not hate. Hatred is merely an emotion, a response to an action performed by someone. So to use your example about the person shooting up a school; we can hate his action, we can really dislike him as a person... but this does not mean that we are unable to love him. The opposite of love is indifference. With indifference, we refuse to recognize that the other person is created in the image and likeness of God. We see her as less than human, as someone that does not deserve our attention; we do not care whether she lives or dies.

How do we love the person that performs a heinous act against society? I think it's important to pray. We should ask the Lord to watch over the victims and their families. We should pray for the perpetrator; that God might call him to conversion, that he might receive a sense of repentance and get the help necessary to get to heaven. And then, of course, we need to pray for ourselves! If we are struggling with feelings of hatred or anger, we need to give them over to God. We need to recognize that holding on to bitterness and resentments is like drinking poison and hoping that the other person gets sick. By loving this person, we are truly embracing the essence of our faith.

As to the question about our military personnel, the Catechism of the Catholic Church goes into great detail about defending Peace and the principles of the Just War (see paragraph 2309 for this discussion). Immediately after outlining the principles of Just War, the Catechism gives this description about soldiers:

"Public authorities have the right and duty to impose on citizens the obligations necessary for national defense. Those who are sworn to serve their country in the armed forces are servants of the security and freedom of nations. If they carry out their duty honorably, they truly contribute to the common good of the nation and the maintenance of peace" (# 2310).

It is a very precarious situation for the members of our military. When in the service of our country, they often find themselves in harm's way. It's important to look at this as a case of justice. Imagine that two 10 year olds are hanging off the side of a cliff, and you can only save one of them; the first child is a complete stranger, and the other one is your daughter. Justice mandates that you save your own child. I know this is a limited analogy, but the soldier has a similar decision; the choice between protecting her nation, and respecting the unjust aggressor. Surely, we are called to love everyone, to will the good of the other as other; but sometimes justice requires that we protect one against the other. As the Catechism points out, our soldiers are living out their vocations and contributing to the peace when they carry out their duty honorably. Let us continue to keep our service men and women in our prayers, and thank them for their service in protecting the well-being of our nation.

Grace Notes

"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." Mark 6:4

I hear so much, especially from middle to older age people, a grief and a sadness over a lack of faith or practicing of religion in their children. We work hard and try to teach our children and our families about God and the faith, but it often feels as if we are failing. Well, you are in good company! Even Jesus had trouble preaching and getting through to his own village family! So you do what you can. You touch those whom you are able. You teach those who will listen. At some point everyone comes of age and follows their own path. When that happens, we need to regroup. At that point, we need to take stock of where we are on our faith journey and tend to our own relationship with the Trinity. We cannot go out and evangelize others into a relationship with Jesus, unless our own relationship is thriving. So attend Mass and receive the sacraments. Go on retreat and attend formation events at the parish. Read a good book about the faith.



As you take care of your relationship with God, be patient with those around you. Some relationships take more time than others. Invite people to Mass, but do not hound. Encourage participation in the sacraments, but do not demand. Share your stories of your faith family and your journey and pay no mind to any criticism you may get. Nurture friends and neighbors who have questions about the faith. If you are challenged beyond what you know, consider that a prompting for you to move further on your journey and find the answers.

Pray for your family so that their faith may increase, but always remember that their journey is their own and perhaps it is not you who is the catalyst for their change. It may be someone else and you may be that someone for another person's family member.

Kid's Tax Credit Scholarship Program

Dear Catholic School Parent or Guardian,

We are writing to you as fellow Catholic School parents to inform you of a unique opportunity to transform needy children's lives in the state of Illinois. Like you, we have chosen to send our own children to Catholic School to be formed in the practice of their faith, nurtured through friendships in their faith community, and educated with a top-quality curriculum delivered by our committed, mission-driven teachers. Through Geno's work on the Archdiocese of Chicago School Board, we are aware that many other parents who would like to make this same formative life choice for their children are unable to do so for lack of adequate financial resources.

That's why this year is an exciting year in Catholic education in the Archdiocese of Chicago. In August 2017 the State of Illinois established the Invest in Kids Tax Credit Scholarship Program to provide needs-based scholarships to private schools. This Scholarship Program offers generous tax incentives to donors. The State of Illinois will refund back 75% of any donation to the Scholarship Fund in the form of a reduction in State Taxes.

So far, donors have contributed \$40.3 Million to support needs-based scholarships for Illinois families. This is a lot of money, but the demand for these scholarships has far exceeded the donations. Over 31,000 students have applied for scholarships, and the current funding will provide for only about 5,000 of them. Most of these families are below 180% of the federal poverty level. There are thousands of qualified families still hoping for scholarships to our Catholic schools for the 2018-2019 school year.

We are personally, deeply moved by the plight of these families. Just like us, they want to bring their children up in the faith, and they want top-quality education. This program offers these families an equitable choice in their child's education.

We are asking for your help to meet this enormous need. With the Tax Credit Scholarship Program, you get a lot of bang for your charitable buck, since you get back most of your donation in tax relief. But more importantly, your donation is an act of solidarity with families like your own who want faith-based, high-quality education for their children.
